President's Note

E-menace

Police called the incident "a tragic accident". The local news team reported that folks who lived in the area were astonished to find out two kids were so badly injured. "It's very sad, it's terrible to hear, I mean, you never want to hear a story like that," said one local resident.

Days later, one of the juveniles succumbed to her injuries after she and her best friend, who were sharing a ride on an e-scooter, were struck by a car.

In another incident, investigators ruled out speed or drinking as contributing factors in the death of a 14-year-old who was struck and killed while riding his e-bike. The adult female driver and her juvenile passengers were unhurt, but they will have to live with what happened for the rest of their lives.

The latter incident happened July 17, 2025 in Somers Point, New Jersey. The Egg Harbor teen died of his wounds at the Level 1 Trauma Center at Cooper University Hospital in Camden two days later.

The scene of the former tragic event played out the month prior in Delaware County, Pennsylvania. It was the beginning of the summer season - a time of excitement and activity for children recently released from the tethers of the classroom.

Two young girls - best of friends, their families said - were sharing a ride on an electric scooter when they were thrown from it into oncoming traffic as they entered the road.

While our hearts go out to the affected families, it is easy to see how this can happen. Look at our own streets. How many e-scooters and e-bikes did you see over the summer? This fall on the way to/from school? Were they all sharing the roadway responsibly, safely?

The popularity of e-bikes - bicycles with electric motors - has risen dramatically due partly to their being a cost-effective, environmentally-friendly substitute to cars. Users relate that they are fun to ride and make commuting and exploration faster and

more convenient.

The surge in popularity has also meant more ebikes on the roads that are dominated by much larger, heavier, and faster cars and trucks. Mix in the ebike/e-scooter riders who are inexperienced or fail to follow the rules that apply to all roadway users, and you have a pot ready to boil over.

In response to the Somers Point tragedy and in an effort to protect riders, three New Jersey lawmakers have proposed legislation that would require riders of Class I and II e-bikes to undergo safety training courses.

NJ State Senator Vince Polistina, Assemblywoman Claire Swift, and Assemblyman Don Guardian are also seeking to establish regulations that will enable e-bikes, bicycles, and motorized vehicles to share the roadways safely.

"Abby's Law", named after the 12-year-old who died in June, is sponsored by Pennsylvania Senator Timothy Kearney. The law would require e-scooter users to be at least 16 years of age and require older teen riders to wear a helmet.

Last year, a University of California San Francisco study noted that e-scooter injuries rose by 45 percent annually from 2017 to 2022. According to another source, e-bike injuries doubled during the same time period.

Also last year, the American College of Surgeons issued a public warning. The bulletin, *Electric Bikes are Emerging as Public Health Hazard*, noted that "surgeons around the world have witnessed a serious pattern of e-bike-related injury and death."

How many e-vehicles do you think will be under the Christmas tree next month? Will the parents take the time to educate their kids on e-mobility safety? As a community, we can work together to protect our young people and avoid a recurrence of the tragedies that began this conversation. Let's keep talking and doing.







From family vacations to anniversary trips, Kissimmee's a great place to go for a mix of excitement and relaxation. You'll be close to world-famous theme parks, while also having plenty to do right in town.

Staying in Kissimmee also means you're close to Orlando, one of the top family vacation spots in the US. There's no shortage of things to do and parks to explore when you're here, but that can make it harder to plan your upcoming trip.

If you have a flexible schedule for your trip to Kissimmee, certain seasons might offer a better or less expensive experience than others. That depends on your budget, what you want to see, and what type of weather you like. Here are a few ideas to help you get started on making this decision.

If you want a vacation filled with water activities, plan to visit here during the summer months. You can escape the heat and humidity on water rides and in swimming pools. Keep in mind that this is the rainy season here, though, and it's the most expensive and most crowded time to visit.

The winter months are a great time to come to Kissimmee for vacation. Temperatures during the day are usually in the 70s, so walking around is more comfortable than in summer. It's also not as rainy.

Simple Guide on Renewing Your Passport

Keeping your passport up to date has a few benefits. No one wants to start planning a dream vacation only to find they have to postpone or miss out on a last-minute deal because their passport has expired. You also don't want to leave your passport expired beyond the renewal period.

Renewing a passport is easier than applying for a new one, and it eliminates the risk of not having a valid passport in time for upcoming travel — it can take over two months between submitting your renewal application to receiving your new passport. While you have up to five years after your passport expires, it's best to renew your passport before its expiration because many countries require U.S. citizens' passports to be valid for at least six months after their scheduled departure. Whether your passport is expiring within a year or expired a few years ago, it's time to renew.

Is My Passport Eligible for Renewal?

Age 15 or younger: Passports issued to children age 15 or younger cannot be renewed. Parents or legal guardians must submit an application for a new passport in person for their children.

Age 16 and 17: If you are 16 or 17, you also cannot renew your passport, but you can apply for a new passport with proof of a parent's or guardian's consent.

Age 18 to 24: You cannot renew a passport issued when you were age 15 or under, so you must apply for a new passport.

Age 25 and older: If your current passport was issued when you were 16 or older, was valid for 10 years, and is expiring within a year or expired no more than five years ago, you can renew your passport.

Renew Your Passport Online

If you are eligible for renewal and have not changed your name, you can renew your passport online at travel.state.gov. You must complete and submit the online application within seven days, or you will have to restart the application process. You need your passport, a digital passport photo in JPEG format, and a debit or credit card to pay the fee.

Renew Your Passport by Mail


If you've changed your name since receiving your current passport, you must renew your passport by mail. Download the renewal form at travel.state.gov and follow the instructions. In an envelope addressed to the Passport Processing Center, include your current passport along with the completed renewal form, a passport photo, a check or money order for the renewal fee, and if you changed your name, a certified copy of a document showing your legal name change (like a marriage certificate). The processing center will mail your document and old passport back to you separately.

How Long Does It Take to Renew a Passport?

Online: It can take six to eight weeks from submitting your renewal application online to receiving your new passport in the mail.

Mail: It can take eight to ten weeks from mailing your renewal application to receiving your new passport in the mail

If you need your passport within six weeks, use an expedited passport service like RushMyPassport. RushMyPassport offers a discount to AAA members for expedited passport services.



Lamentable

Dear Ask Ed,

I am lamenting the demise of a wonderful truck; a 1994 XLT Ford Ranger.

Its exterior is in perfect condition, and it only has 185,370 miles. In recent years, I have only driven it about 2,000 miles per year, primarily short distances on country roads in the Hamburg area to Lowe's, Walmart, etc. I do not take it on interstates.



However, I am now forced to take it to a Ford graveyard, i.e., the Ford section of an auto junkyard, since I can't get it past annual inspection!! It failed inspection for one problem: the small leak at the valve cover. Otherwise it would have passed. The garage does not see this as a simple fix since they can't locate a valve cover for the 1994 XLT Ford Ranger, even when searching aftermarket and used part sources. A single part is now impossible to obtain; the left side valve cover.

Yes, that "lid" has slight oil seepage around a deteriorating edge. But is this oil seepage sufficient for ending the truck's glorious existence?

So, I wonder: Is there a way for repairing this valve cover? Is some type of sealant possible that can prevent the oil seepage? Should I consider replacing the engine with a rebuilt one?

I'm sure you have recommendations.

I really hate the thought of having this almost vintage truck left languishing amidst all the deteriorating junkyard wrecks.

Hi, Dale. Thanks for your email.

My wife and I are both inspection mechanics and we





teach classes for PennDOT to get mechanics their inspection licenses (both Emissions and Safety). Nowhere in the inspection manual does it say "Check and REJECT if there is an oil leak". An inspector cannot fail a vehicle for an oil leak. You need to report the inspection station to PennDOT.

Also, valve covers are available in aftermarket and used parts.

You mentioned the Hamburg area. I would recommend that you make an inspection appointment at Always Towing and Service Center at 201 S. Third Street in Hamburg. Their phone number is 610-914-4567. They are a AAA Approved Auto Repair facility. If you want to get that oil leak fixed, I know they can help you with that.

best time to book a Cruise 32

You've picked a cruising destination, the perfect ship and you can practically feel the salty, cool air on your face. But before you secure your purchase, you ask yourself, when's the best time to book a cruise? Book too early and you may miss a better deal. Book too late and you could lose out on your desired cabin or early bird discounts. Timing makes a difference.

Booking in Advance (6-18 Months Out)

If you like to plan early for clarity and security, then this option is for you. Most experts agree that planning ahead is best if you're seeking the optimal balance of value and control. Many companies release route itineraries more than 12 months out, with some showing availability up to 18 months. However, the most desirable cabins, especially those in coveted destinations like Hawaii or the Mediterranean, may sell out more quickly. Booking six to 18 months ahead allows you to plan flights, choose excursions and set ship reservations without the rush.

Cruise lines often incentivize early planners with great bonuses, such as lower deposits, free or discounted cabin upgrades, early booking access to onboard activities and special events that require reservations, priority when selecting excursions or dining, or onboard credits for specialty dining, spa sessions or Wi-Fi.

Booking early means you can put your lifestyle first. For families, this means figuring out how to align with school schedules or considering where everyone will be in a year. For adult cruise line travelers, early bookings mean ample time to request vacation days and extra time to plan special events. Purchasing your cruise early also gives travelers ample time to take off work or cover at-home obligations such as pet care and home maintenance.

The Last-Minute Gamble (0-8 Weeks Before Departure)

A last-minute booking strategy is best for the flexible traveler. If you have a calendar with wide-open availability, can pack quickly or are open to different destinations, you can snag a high-value package. This is because cruise lines would rather have heads in beds over empty cabins, which you can use to your advantage.

Cruise lines may cut rates on unsold cabins as the departure date approaches, about a month or two before the sail date. This is best suited for the solo traveler, a retired couple or anyone with an open schedule. You may even score a balcony for the cost of an inside room. There will be tradeoffs. You may pay more for airfare, have fewer cabin options and, during popular cruise dates, you could have limited onboard reservation availability. You may have to roll with the punches, but with an open mind, it might pay off.

Seasonal Trends and Major Promotions

The best time to take a cruise extends beyond your sail date and depends on the time of the year. For example, the best time to cruise to Alaska is in May, with the season boasting some of the best prices. Shoulder

Keep an eye on any seasonal trends in the area you plan to cruise in. You can look into past sales trends to predict when a new one will pop up in the current year. You can also subscribe to promotional email lists for seasonal updates and discounts.

Use a Travel Agent

Booking a cruise with a travel agent can unlock added perks and simplify the process. Travel agents can access deals and extras you won't see online. - Road Trip Prep Tips for a Safer Journey: "When will we get there" is asked by kids once every 20-30 minutes (40%), and in some cases more frequently (31%), according to parents surveyed by Chicco. AAA's Trip Canvas tool (AAA.com/tripcanvas) allows users to search local guides and recommended activities from experienced travel editors to make sure the whole family has a more relaxing journey to their destination.
- Safe Driving Tips for New Parents: Drive defensively and keep your eyes up and brain on. Always search the entire traffic scene so you see everything going around you in all directions and keep a huge donut of space around your vehicle – especially to the front.
- Tips for Alternative Methods of Travel: It's always recommended to bring your own car seat when you can. If you must rent, like with rental cars and international travel, always check the expiration date and make sure you have access to a user's manual.

"A car seat that is properly installed and used correctly is the first line of defense that parents can take to keep young passengers safe in the backseat," said William Hasse, VP of Marketing for Chicco USA. "Once again, by combining our expertise in child safety with AAA's vast knowledge of road safety, we hope to make it easier for parents juggling it all to feel confident they've taken the steps needed to enhance the safety of their traveling family."

ADA: Promising Tech, Lingering Challenges

Advanced vehicle technology is becoming increasingly common, presenting both opportunities and challenges. AAA Automotive Engineers evaluated five passenger vehicles with low-speed-capable Active Driving Assistance (ADA) systems, also known as Traffic Jam Assistance, in heavy traffic. Traffic Jam Assistance is a new vehicle technology designed to help drivers manage stop-and-go traffic by automatically applying the brakes when traffic comes to a halt and resuming acceleration as traffic moves.

The study compared hands-on and hands-off ADA performance. Notable events occurred every 9 minutes on average. The most common events were cut-ins and poor lane centering.

"This technology is not a replacement for paying attention behind the wheel," said Greg Brannon, director of Automotive Research. "Drivers really need to stay alert and cut down on distractions, especially when things get busy on the road."

In total, notable events were recorded every 3.2 miles, which is approximately every 9.1 minutes on average. A "notable" event was defined as any situation in which the ADA system failed to handle the driving conditions adequately, as determined by the researcher driving the vehicle.

The most common incidents reported were inadequate responses to cut-ins, which required a researcher to inter-

vene 90% of the time. Cut-ins are defined as instances when a vehicle enters the lane directly in front of the test vehicle.

The second most frequent issue was inadequate Lane Centering Assistance. Lane Centering is a driver assistance system that uses cameras and other sensors to keep a vehicle centered within its lane, providing steering assistance to prevent drifting.

Engineers reported a difference between hands-on and hands-off ADA systems. Hands-on systems require the driver to keep their hands on the steering wheel while the ADA system is in use. The ADA system utilizes sensors such as cameras and radar to monitor the driving environment (road condition, lane lines, etc.).

Hands-off systems allow the driver to remove their hands from the steering wheel in most situations but may require them to put their hands back on in certain conditions. These systems use similar sensors, but they also commonly rely on roads that are pre-mapped in the system.

AAA's ongoing testing of vehicle technology helps drivers make smart decisions about purchases and influences industry and regulators to build safer vehicles. The goal is to save lives through advocacy, education and research.

AAA: Most Drivers Experience Road Rage

If it feels like everyone has road rage these days, that's because they probably do. A staggering 96% of drivers admit to engaging in aggressive driving behaviors over the past year, according to a new study from the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety. From speeding and tailgating to cutting off other vehicles, aggressive driving has become a near universal experience – and it's not just frustrating, it appears to be contagious.

The study found that the more drivers are exposed to aggressive behavior on the road, the more likely they are to drive aggressively themselves. This self-fulfilling cycle of aggressive driving and road rage is fueling a culture where impatience and hostility are becoming the norm behind the wheel.

"Driving can be a stressful experience due to behaviors of others on the road and how you respond to various situations. Our study finds that experiencing various forms of aggressive driving behaviors is common for almost all motorists and many drive aggressively," said Dr. David Yang, president and executive director of the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety. "This work also concludes that road etiquette and manners can be a protective factor against aggressive driving. Let's change our driving culture so we can achieve the safe mobility vision for all road users."

Other Key Findings:

- · 92% of drivers reported aggressive behaviors that put others at risk, like speeding or cutting off other vehicles. Their top motivators were to get to their destination faster and avoid perceived danger.
- · 11% admitted to violent actions such as intentionally bumping

another car or confronting another driver.

- · Aggressive driving is contagious: Drivers who experienced higher levels of aggressive driving also had higher levels of engagement in aggressive driving.
- The vehicle plays a role: The kind of car you drive could predict how you act and how others perceive you. Drivers in sports cars, big trucks, and motorcycles are often seen as more aggressive. Some drivers say they felt more powerful and dominant behind the wheel of these vehicles.

This latest study updates research originally conducted by the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety in 2016, offering a look at how aggressive driving behaviors have shifted over time. While some behaviors have become more common, others have declined:

Since 2016:

- · Cutting off other vehicles is up
- · Honking out of anger is up 47%.
- · On the positive side, tailgating is

down 24% and yelling at other drivers is down 17%.

AAA encourages drivers to prioritize courtesy and safety to help curb aggressive driving. In fact, the study found that encouraging good road etiquette may be the most effective way to reduce aggressive driving and road rage. Simple actions-like using turn signals, letting others merge, and offering a friendly wave-can help deescalate tension and create a safer, more respectful driving environment for everyone.

"Having good manners

behind the wheel isn't just about being polite," said Dr. Jose Torres, AAA traffic safety advocacy and research manager. "It's about ensuring the safety and well-being of everyone on the road."

- Stay Calm Don't Engage
 No eye contact, no gestures, no response.
- 2. Give Space Let them pass and keep your distance.
- 3. Protect Yourself
 Call 911 or go to a public place –

 One deep breath can reset your
 drive and attitude.
- 2. Don't Take the Bait Ignore and avoid aggressive drivers.

On The Road

On the PA Turnpike, 'Safety Always' Matters

The Pennsylvania Turnpike
Commission is committed to educating the public on work zone safety and enhancing protection for workers and motorists. Since 2015, the annual "Go Orange" campaign has reminded drivers that everyone plays a role in ensuring that they and all highway responders return home safely each day.

The Commission invests in training, initiatives and safety equipment to support safer roads. In 2024, the PA Turnpike piloted a new rear-facing air horn system to quickly alert motorists approaching Truck-Mounted Attenuators (TMA). TMAs,

attached to

the rear of maintenance vehicles, are designed to absorb colliTake the pledge to 'Go Orange'

sion impact and reduce crash severity. The air horn system provides a fast, loud alert to motorists if they are approaching too quickly. A trial program for these driver-triggered warning sirens is underway near Jefferson Hills, Burnt Cabins, Everett and Donegal along the system. During the initial eight-month period, the horns have been triggered more than 100 times.

Beyond the air horns, travelers will also see green lights throughout the state. Act 78, passed in 2024, permits these lights on vehicles to make construction and maintenance activity more visible. Green lights, combined with existing flashing yellow lights, address high visibility standards, especially within foggy or snowy weather. This technology has been successful in other states,

such as Ohio, Michigan, Maine, Connecticut, North Carolina, Maryland and New York. Act 78 is the latest Pennsylvania law, backed by the Commission, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, and the Pennsylvania State Police, to enhance roadway safety.

Other recent legislation includes the Work Zone Speed Safety Camera program, which issues violations to motorists exceeding posted work zone speed limits, captured by vehicle-mounted systems. The 2020 Move Over law requires drivers to shift into an adjacent lane, if safe, or slow down no more than 20 mph below


> the posted speed limit when approaching an emergency response area. Finally, Paul Miller's Law, which took effect in June,

prohibits hand-held mobile device usage while driving.

The stakes couldn't be higher. With drivers more connected than ever, even the smallest distractions can lead to serious consequences. Reckless or distracted driving's impact goes beyond license points or financial penalties; it's a matter of life and death for those working to improve the PA Turnpike.
