### Hat's Off to the Merry Merry Month of May

Scottish poet James Thomson penned, "Among the changing months, May stands confessed the sweetest, and in fairest colors dressed!"

As a month, May has a lot going for it. May Day, Cinco de Mayo, Mother's Day, Armed Forces Day, National Maritime Day, and Memorial Day, just to name a few of the special observances packed into a 31-day time span.

Lesser known observances include School Principal's Day (May 1), World Tuna Day (May 2), No Socks Day (May 8), Root Canal Appreciation Day (May 12 - thank your favorite dentist, I guess) and Dance Like a Chicken Day (May 14).

The seasonally transitional month of May is often the time chosen for spring cleaning. Just as we benefit from a clean home, the same can be said about the environment in general.

AAA recognizes the importance of conservation and the impact an organization of our size can have on the environment. As a result, AAA educates drivers on the maintenance needed to extend a vehicle's time on the road as well as ways to conserve fuel and reduce emissions.

Raising public awareness is only part of AAA's commitment to greater sustainability for the planet. The idea of being "green" is integrated into many of our business practices. Since 1992, AAA has collaborated with the National Parks and other similar groups to promote ecotourism. Two automotive initiatives, AAA's battery program and Car Care Month, offer ways for members and the public to operate and maintain their vehicles in an environmentally conscientious manner.

On a state and national level, AAA supports legislation that encourages drivers and industries to minimize the impact of vehicles on the environment. Many of our clubs have moved to paperless systems both with our members and around the office.

Employees across AAA also volunteer for a wide range of environmental activities, from cleanups to tree plantings to events promoting biking.

This month show your vehicle a little TLC to keep it in top shape. AAA offers these reminders:

- Monthly checks pick a day that's easy to remember and mark your calendar to check your tire pressure, tire condition and fluid levels like oil, coolant and windshield washer on the same day each month. If needed, top off any fluids that are low and inflate tires to the recommended level.
- Keep it clean regularly wash and wax your vehicle. This simple task removes any grit or grime from the road that can damage paint and lower a car's resale value.
- Vehicle inspections AAA Approved Auto Repair shops offer a free vehicle inspection along with other types of service. Oil changes are the perfect time to take advantage of convenient inspections to make sure all the vehicle systems, the car battery and more, are operating at full capacity. Additionally, it's a good opportunity to get to know your mechanic and stay ahead of any possible larger issues down the road.
- Pay attention to sounds, smells or fluids leaking from your car. Ignoring these warning signs could lead to a major repair that could have otherwise been avoided.

Keeping up with these car care basics are not only easy but will help prolong the life of your car and may also alert you to a potential issue before you end up stranded by a breakdown.

### **Quiet Killer - Drowsy Driving**

Driving while battling the urge to fall asleep is a familiar feeling for many. However, recently published research from the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety reveals the shocking lethality of drowsy driving.

According to the new study:

- 18% of all traffic fatalities between 2017 and 2021 were estimated to involve a drowsy driver, accounting for nearly 30,000 deaths.
- 6,725 estimated lives were claimed by drowsy drivers in 2021 alone.

These figures are far higher than official government statistics, highlighting the underreported nature of drowsy driving crashes. According to NHTSA, there is agreement across the traffic safety, sleep science, and public health communities that the impact of drowsy driving is underestimated.

The AAA Foundation's study,

based on in-depth crash investigations and national fatal crash data, estimates that drowsy driving is a factor in roughly ten times as many traffic fatalities as traditional crash data indicates.

Drowsiness impairs drivers in several ways:

- Reduced alertness. Makes it harder to react quickly to hazards. Just one hour less than the expert-recommended minimum of 7 hours of sleep increases risk of crashing.
- Hazardous Microsleeps can cause momentary lapses in consciousness, leading to loss of control of the vehicle and failure to respond to dangers on the road.

So, what can you do to stay safe on the road?

 Get enough sleep before driving.
 Aim for at least seven hours of sleep per night.

- Travel at times of the day when you are normally awake. Avoid driving when you are tired or sleepy.
- Take breaks every two hours or 100 miles. Get out of the car, stretch your legs, and get fresh air. Plan and identify safe, comfortable places to take breaks. Don't wait until you're already feeling drowsy.
- Avoid heavy meals before driving.
   Eating a large meal can make you feel tired and sluggish.
- Avoid alcohol and drugs. Both can impair your driving ability. Besides harming driving directly, they can also amplify drowsiness.
- Listen to your body. If you start to feel tired, pull over and take a break.
   Don't try to push through it.
- Don't underestimate the power of a quick nap. A 20- to 30-minute nap can significantly improve your alertness.

tions of Lester Miller Family dancers-some as young as two years old!

These and many other firsts, for seventy-four years, have drawn generations of families, artists, musicians, craftsmen, quilters, entertainers, scholars, and purveyors of iconic food and food experiences to a festival recognized nationally for its authentic Pennsylvania German culture. In fact, this year, USA TODAY 10BEST ranked the Kutztown Folk Festival #3 in the category of Best Cultural Festival.

Located at the Kutztown Fairgrounds, 450 Wentz Street, the nine-day event will run this year from June 29 through July 7, 2024. Heather Zimmerman, Festival



Director, remarks, "We are so excited to approach our 74th Kutztown Folk Festival this June. This celebration of our PA Dutch culture brings friends and families from all over to enjoy our authentic foods, unique culture and craftsmen, lively entertainers, and handcrafted quilts. We invite everyone to come join us this year for a festival full of memories to be made."

The literal fabric of the festival has been pieced by generations of families invested year after year in celebrating traditions they remember fondly and want to share. "For a lot of the people—it is nostalgia—they want to see what they saw as kids," noted Craig Koller, Quilt Auction emcee. Kay Bennecoff, host of BCTV's *Your Berks Craftsmen*, notes, "Of course, to the people in Berks County, it is tradition. Kids grew up with it—now those kids, who are older, bring their kids and grandkids back to see it."

The festival used to be a focus of the granges and 4-H Clubs. In fact, Lester Miller, renowned Hoedown Caller, and part of the "First Family of the Festival," according to Dave Kline, award-winning singer-songwriter, explained that a dance competition among the granges and 4-H Clubs in the early years was the origin of the Hoedown Stage. To commemorate the Lester Miller family tradition, the Lester Miller Family Stage was dedicated in 2023.

A History Trail featuring local people who have supported and shaped the decades-long development of the festival was unveiled in 2023. Patrick Donmoyer, Director of the Pennsylvania German Cultural Heritage Center, designs the panels that pay tribute; new ones will be unveiled this June.

As inspirational as the festival founders and sustainers are the guilts that will be auctioned on Saturday, July 6, 2024, in the world-famous Quilt Barn. Cyndi Hershey, Quilt Education and Development Director, notes "I am planning to post "My Inspiration" cards around the Quilt Barn, and I've asked contributing quilters to send me their thoughts on what inspires them in their quilting journey." She also shares that demonstrations of handquilting will continue, and, new this year, visitors will see demonstrations of machine-piecing, applique, and quilting. Education, after all, is an essential part of the Quilt Barn experience. "We offered our first guilt classes this winter with a variety of topics at the Kutztown Historical Society. Attendees seemed very engaged and offered positive feedback. We hope to offer classes in the fall and in other locations." ### **Tire Wear Satisfaction Poll**

A recent J.D. Power press release revealed the results of their latest customer poll regarding tire owner satisfaction rankings.

Michelin came out a clear winner in several categories. In the luxury tire segment, the innovative brand ranked highest for the 21st consecutive year. Goodyear came in second with Continental ranking third.

Michelin also took first place among passenger car owners. Goodyear placed second in the poll while Kumho came in third.

Performance sport tire customers also gave Michelin top scores, while Falken took first place in the truck/utility segment, followed by BFGoodrich and Hankook.

An interesting side note emerged from the poll data regarding con-

sumer expectation on tire wear. The widely recognized automotive data and research leader noted in their March 25, 2024 press release that "The satisfaction gap with original equipment tires between electric vehicles (EVs) and gas-powered vehicles is widening, as EV owners say their tires are wearing faster."

"The widening satisfaction gap between EVs and gas-powered vehicles highlight an opportunity for tire manufacturers and automakers to educate EV owners on the differences in performance," said Ashley Edgar, senior director of benchmarking and alternative mobility at J.D. Power.





### **A Loaded Question**

### Dear Ask Ed:

I'm not sure if you can help me, but lately I've been noticing more and more cars and trucks with what look like unstable loads. It's more than the it-would-be-funny-if-it-wasn't-so-dangerous cliche driver and passenger with their arms hanging out the window holding on to a mattress. There's a guy who drives a small pickup in my area that must be a junk hauler rusty bikes, metal tables, and other unsecured trash. I've seen things fall off his truck but he just keeps going so the cars behind him have to deal with whatever it was that fell.

What chance does a safe driver have against these motorway maniacs? Do you have any advice for those of us who must be uber vigilant to make up for others who lack any type of common sense?

Thank you allowing me to rant. Phil M.

Dear Phil,

Wow. I sense your frustration and I've seen that type of situation myself. Unfortunately, we have to deal with bad drivers who make bad decisions when trying to get some type of load from Point A to Point B (just sit in the parking lot of a big box store). That being said, we can and should exercise our common sense and be on the lookout for such situations so we're ready to take appropriate action. Here are some tips:

- Report unsafe vehicles, unsecured loads and road debris. You can contact PennDOT's online Customer Care Center at customercare.penndot.gov/eCCC/eCCC.nsf or by calling 1-800-FIX-ROAD.
- Brush up on defensive driving, especially around trucks or other vehicles carrying large or difficult-to-secure cargo.
- Focus your vision farther down the road. Scan at least 12 seconds ahead so you have time to react to changing highway conditions including road debris. Sudden movements by cars ahead of you often indicate a hazard on the road.
- Sometimes it's safer to run over debris rather than trying to avoid it. If you can't change lanes, slow down. Striking minor road debris can be far less dangerous than veering into oncoming traffic or swerving off the pavement.

Knowing where the cars around you are will help you make the right decision.

Road debris, including "escaped" cargo that wasn't correctly secured, is estimated to cause more than 50,000 crashes annually in the U.S. Many of these crashes and the resultant repair costs and human toll can be prevented. For those who must haul a large load, use the correct type of transport such as a truck and proper safety straps, a van where the cargo can be contained inside the vehicle, or a trailer with the appropriate tie downs. Secure your cargo adequately before you hit the road and check it every time you stop.

# planning your first camping trip



The North American Camping & Outdoor Hospitality Report estimates that 92 million American households identify as campers and 58 million households camp at least once a year. If you'd like to get in on that action but aren't sure how, AAA can help.

In the March/April 2024 issue of *On The Go* we shared some tips for first-time campers on selecting the right type of camping for your family and how to select a good family camping destination. In this issue we'll share some more great tips to make your first camping experience a memorable one - and one you'll want to repeat.

### What to Pack for Camping

Once you've chosen your level of camping and your destination, it's time to think about what to pack for your trip. If you rent an RV or stay in a pre-assembled glamping tent rental, you'll have less gear to worry about, as your furnishings and cooking and dining essentials will probably be provided. If tent camping sounds like a fun fit for your family, here is a list of the basic gear to consider:

### **Tent**

Tents are available in a wide range of sizes, designs and prices. Look for a simple design such as a dome tent that will be easy to assemble. A screened roof with a removable cover provides shelter from showers and shades your belongings from the sun during the day while letting you see the stars at night. Tents are categorized by the number of people they sleep, but pay attention to the floor dimen-

sions instead. A four-person tent typically has just enough space for four sleeping bags side by side, with no extra room for belongings. When considering price, there's no need to splurge on an elaborate, costly design if you're planning shorter trips in mild weather. You can find a sixperson, name-brand tent for under \$200 that will work fine for a family of four.

Practice pitching your tent in the backyard so you'll be able to set up camp quickly on your trip. You can even have a practice campout with the kids to test all your gear and let them experience sleeping outdoors.

### **Sleeping Bags**

Like tents, sleeping bags vary in design and price according to purpose. Consider the climate and season where you'll be camping and choose your sleeping bag accordingly. An inflatable sleeping pad or mattress will make sleeping on the tent floor much more pleasant. In very warm climates in summer, you may want to skip the sleeping bag and use an old set of sheets over your sleeping pad instead.

### **Chairs**

Bring a canvas camp chair or folding lawn or lounge chair for each person, as campsites typically only have a picnic table for seating.



### Grill

Most campsites include a fire pit that may have a grill rack over it, and many also include a charcoal grill. Either way, you'll want to bring your own clean grill racks if you plan to cook your meals over the fire. Check ahead to see what your campsite includes; if needed, bring a small, portable charcoal grill. Campgrounds often have firewood available for purchase and may also have a camp store where you can buy charcoal and lighter fluid. Phone the campground before your trip to find out what's available.

### **Propane Stove**

While it's possible to cook entirely over a fire, a propane stove is a great addition to your camping equipment collection. Portable and easy to set up, it allows you to cook anything you'd cook on the stove at home and quickly and easily heats water for your morning coffee so you don't have to build a fire.

### **Lanterns and Flashlights**

As lovely as a campfire is, you'll need more light to find your way around the campsite in the dark. Bring several lanterns to hang around the campsite and at least two powerful flashlights so family members can navigate to restrooms and showers at night.

### **Cooking and Eating Utensils and Other Necessities**

Depending on what you plan to eat on your trip, cooking necessities might include a frying pan, a saucepan, spatulas and a pot for boiling water. Hot dog skewers are nice to have, as are grilling accessories such as grill baskets for fish or vegetables. Aluminum foil also works for cooking fish and vegetables on the grill or over the campfire.

Adding a set of reusable eating utensils, non-breakable plates and bowls to your camping gear will reduce waste

and give you one less thing for your shopping list for future trips. However, be warned, some campsites discourage using communal water sources for washing dishes, so you may need to wash dishes at your campsite. For your first trip, consider disposables to keep dishwashing to a minimum. Phone your campground to find out what washing facilities are available. At a minimum, you'll need biodegradable dish soap, a sponge and dish towels, and you may need bins or buckets. You'll also need paper towels, napkins and trash bags, as most campsites don't have individual trash bins.

### Cooler

Bring at least one large cooler with enough room to store perishable items. Ideally, bring a second cooler so you'll have plenty of room for ice and beverages.

### **Staying Safe Outdoors**

Bring plenty of insect repellant and sunscreen. A little rain is no problem if you pack a few inexpensive plastic rain ponchos. A first aid kit is handy for those little nicks and scrapes that come with kids playing outdoors.

### More Tips for a Fun, Safe Camping Trip

- Pack favorite toys and games for younger children as well as games, puzzles or playing cards for older kids and adults. These can provide fun, screen-free family time for evenings and rainy days.
- Download apps with activities your family can do together while camping. Two popular apps are Geocaching, in which families can search for hidden items using GPS coordinates, and Star Walk 2, which shows stars visible from your location and where to look for stars, constellations and satellites. Apps for identifying birds, plants and insects can make hiking more fun for kids.
- Store all of your camping gear together in plastic bins so you can simply toss the bins in the car when you're ready to go instead of having to hunt for and pack every item you'll need for every trip. Laundry baskets are perfect for storing and transporting foods that don't need to be in a cooler.

At the campsite, store food, including coolers, in your car so wildlife can't get to it. Don't keep any food in your tent, or you may return from a hike to find that your snack stash has disappeared through a new, raccoon-sized hole.

• Don't forget to pack masks, sanitizing wipes and hand sanitizer for any stops you make on your way to and from the campground and any restaurants, stores or attractions you may visit during your trip.


AAA table to hear more about their many services.

# On The Road

### Effects of Rain and Dirt on ADAS

When it rains, wet roads and decreased visibility can make driving conditions more dangerous. But did you know it can also affect how your advanced driver assistance system (ADAS) performs? AAA conducted research and found that things like rain, bugs, & dirt can obstruct the cameras and sensors these systems rely on to do their job.

### **Research Methods**

Rain: To simulate moderate to heavy rainfall, AAA engineers designed a system using a reservoir to hold water, a high-pressure pump for a consistent flow of water and a precision injector nozzle to spray the windshield. This system was secured in the cargo area of the test vehicle and was connected to a nozzle positioned above the windshield so that the spray pattern covered the entire windshield.


Dirt/Bugs: To simulate a dirty windshield, AAA engineers created a custom stamp applicator and a concentrated solution of dirt and bugs. The stamp was dipped in the solution and applied to the windshield in front of and around system cameras located behind the windshield.

 AAA tested lane keeping assistance and automatic emergency braking and found that overall, both

cated behind the windshield.

Key Findings

• AAA tested lane keeping assis-



• During testing with a simulated dirty (bugs/dirt) windshield, minor differences were noted, however, performance of automatic emergency braking and lane keeping assistance were not impacted. ADAS cameras can still be influenced by a dirty windshield. AAA recommends drivers keep their windshields clean for their own visibility and to ensure their ADAS system camera is not obstructed.

### AAA's Recommendation to Automakers

Typically, advanced driver assistance systems are tested in ideal conditions free of environmental factors like dirt, bugs, rain, fog, sleet, snow and lighting. Automakers and other vehicle safety organizations test this way in order to maximize test repeatability and limit variables that can skew results. AAA advocates for automakers and other safety organizations that test and rate vehicles to expand testing scenarios to include those that are more closely aligned with the real-world conditions drivers regularly face.

### **AAA's Advice to Drivers**

- Stay alert and don't use cruise control or rely on vehicle safety systems in adverse weather conditions or in situations in which they are not designed to perform.
- Take time to learn more about these systems, especially if their vehicle is equipped with the technology. The best way to



do this is to grab your vehicle's owner manual, which will tell you when, where and how your vehicle's safety system works best. Regardless, this technology is only intended to assist and drivers must remain fully engaged (and in the driver's seat) when behind the wheel.

Adverse weather conditions, such as rain or snow, can make driving more challenging. AAA has also found that vehicle safety systems may not work as well in these situations. To help navigate slick conditions, AAA recommends the following to drivers:

- Keep windshield clean and ensure that wipers are not streaking.
- Slow down and avoid hard braking and sharp turning. If possible, follow in the tracks of other vehicles.
- Increase following distance to 5-6 seconds behind the vehicle ahead.
- Do not use cruise control in order to stay alert and to respond quickly if the car's tires lose traction with the road.
- If the car begins to hydroplane, ease off the accelerator to gradually decrease speed until your tires regain traction, and continue to look and steer where you want to go. Don't jam on the brakes—this can cause further traction loss.
